

Nean Smith. Does the name sound familiar? It is a name synonymous, in our area, with a certain event. Many men, women, children in our community have been affected by this woman's quiet, yet strong voice. Nean is a woman with a cause, a purpose ... and it's personal. Her purpose, if you will, is one that has so obviously been appointed by God. Whether you believe in God or not does not matter in the telling of this true story. This is a story, that if you haven't heard it before, may touch your heart, and if you have then you know it is one that is worth hearing again and again.

Nean is an unassuming woman. She is one of the most humble "soldiers" I have ever had the pleasure of meeting. She wants no personal accolades; yet she is deserving. She will be the first to tell you that she is nothing without her God. She will tell you that all of the glories, the praise, and the gratitude belong to God.

So, you may ask ... who is this woman and what local event does she champion? I will tell you. Not only does Nean "champion" this event every year, this cause, this race to find a cure to, in her words, "stomp out cancer" ... she "authored" it.

Before we talk about the event though ... let us go back 5 years in time and change

Nean was in for just another routine doctor's appointment. After her examination her doctor casually mentioned to her that she may want to have a mammogram. So, upon that advice, she did. That mammogram led to a PET scan, a bone scan, a heart scan and other scans too numerous to mention here. These scans led her doc-

tor to suggest a needle biopsy of Nean's breast. Ah, the needle biopsy ... nothing to fret over ... right??? Dr. Laura Morris was Nean's oncology surgeon. She assured Nean that this biopsy would just be a little uncomfortable. Let's agree to just call it a necessary step in solving a mystery.

I sat down with Nean on September 1st this year and asked her several questions, one of which was:

(Brenda) "Nean ... how did you feel about the biopsy ... were you scared?"

(Nean) "At the very first I just felt like let's get this over with..." she paused and took a deep breath ... "and then, then I felt like I was stuck in mud and I was trying to climb out but I couldn't."

The needle biopsy confirmed that Nean had breast cancer. Dr. Laura Morris immediately counseled Nean that a lumpectomy would be a sound direction to eradicate the cancer. The lumpectomy was scheduled. (Brenda) "How did you feel now?" (Nean) "Stuck in the mud, again."

As Nean was being prepped for surgery, the pastor there asked her if she would like to be anointed prior to her surgery, she didn't hesitate ... "yes" ... and so she was. She said although she had never had surgery of any kind prior to her surgery that day, she felt a huge blanket of peace wash over her. Gary and several friends accompanied Nean to that lumpectomy. Gary is the other half of Nean; he is her best friend, her confidante, her husband. He had no idea going into that appointment that he would have to make an excruciatingly difficult decision; for not long into the lumpectomy procedure (as Nean was still under) Dr. Laura

Morris had to step away to have a word with him. The cancer had been more aggressive than first believed ... a mastectomy was highly recommended. Dr. Morris felt it was imperative that they take it all now ... and not wait. She counseled Gary that if he didn't make that decision for Nean now that she would certainly be seeing Nean back on the operating table in the near future. All of Nean's friends who were there in attendance assured Gary that Nean would be just fine with whatever decision he came to. A mastectomy was performed.

Nean remembers waking up in recovery and Dr. Morris telling her how sorry she was but that they had to "take it all."

Into Nean's life came Dr. Pennington; Nean's oncologist. After accessing Nean's medical records, he sat Nean down and told her (with tears in his eyes) ... "if you were my own daughter I would urge you to have these treatments (chemo and radiation)." Nean said she knew in that moment that "here was a doctor that wanted me to live. He wanted me to live."

After 8 rounds of 3 different types of chemo and 38 rounds of radiation she is wondrously alive and vibrant and thankful! Her release from her treatments was celebrated with cake ... a perfect little cake, actually, that had the words CELEBRATE LIFE in pink icing on top. Nean was convicted that she would do just that ... every little moment ... every day. Night after night she would fall to sleep, thankful; only to be wakened in the night feeling that the Lord was giving her direction. Bit by bit the dawn of realization hit. Faith dictated that she set about making her own fliers, talking to everyone and anyone who would listen about her purpose, her goal. Stacy Pletcher at Rulli's was instrumental in having the shirts printed. Greencroft allowed Nean to hold her 1st event on their property. Hawkins donated all of the water. Nean baked all of the cookies, the brownies, the refreshments. This woman was driven! That first year 119 ... yes, 119 walkers responded! Have you realized the event we are referring to yet? It is MIDDLEBURY WALKS FOR A CURE. That very first event dictated that a new place be found to host any successive events as this woman's purpose had already outgrown its original "home". Das Essenhaus has generously "stepped up to the plate" to host this very necessary celebration for all of the years since. Last year there were 419 walkers and 68 runners participating in the

event that raised over

\$21,000.00 and was launched from one woman's obedience to God as well as her determination in finding a cure so that no other woman, man, or family should have to experience, firsthand, the disease of breast can-

Here we are ... 5 years later and looking forward to this very special time of celebration, courage and determination! When I asked Nean if she were given the opportunity to announce a very public "thank you" to anyone involved in her cancer care and treatment her eyes quickly welled up with tears, yet a beautiful smile found its way to her lips and she nodded, momentarily unable to speak. "Yes ... my husband; Gary, my sons; Ryan, Shawn, and Cory ... my church, my friends ..." as I, too, was moved to tears at that point Nean leaned forward and said "everyone just steps up ... they just step up". So many people, doctors, nurses, clinical secretaries & assistants ... everyone embraced her and supported her in fighting her fight and win-

Speaking of fighting; Nean felt early on that Middlebury needed their own symbol for this event ... one that "stood out" from the common pink ribbon we are all familiar with ... one that was just for those here that were effected/affected/ infected by this hostile disease ... one that symbolized faith, courage and hope ... and her son, Shawn delivered. Shawn's creation speaks to all of us in a very loud and resounding way ... as does his mother's determination. She gives hope to all who have suffered or are suffering at the hand of cancer ... every type of cancer.

My final question to Nean was ... "Do you ever hope for a certain outcome, either monetary or otherwise from this event?"

Without hesitation she responded, "No" ... "whatever God wants ... that's what I want." She went on ... "God said that this was his plan for me ... that he has a plan for all of us" ...

Every year Nean invites a different Pastor to come and offer the opening prayer. She is often asked why she even has a prayer given. Her response is basically that "God is the 1st person you should approach"

He is the reason for her hope, her endurance, her courage, her determination and her persever-

Middlebury Walks For A Cure should be something we all show our support for. If you recall, at the beginning of this article I referred to Nean as a soldier. I'm sure you can see why. She is a soldier fighting in two armies and whether or not you believe in her "General" in the spiritual army she is fighting for; I beseech you to believe that we should all show our support for the many soldiers she fights alongside who will be walking/ running for a cure of a very indiscriminate disease that will undoubtedly touch us all one way or another.

I invite you all to please come out and show your support even if you're unable to give in a monetary way ... give from vour heart and show these "soldiers" that you care.



need to start drinking warm water and eating lots of onions. The thing that impressed me most though was that she was "sharp as a tack" and filled with a youthful and very quick wit


My second thought was ... exercise your brain more. Here is a woman who is twice my age and she is what so many of us hope to be when we age ... vibrant!





Alpacas: my personal definition would be; sweet, soft, cuddly, even-tempered little critters that are just so adorable it's almost impossible not to fall in love with them. The true definition (according to Webster's) is 1 kind of llama 2 cloth from its long, silky wool.

If you want the most accurate definition you should probably consult with someone who lives with Alpacas and knows just about every single thing there is to know about them.

You know what? You're in luck because right here in Middlebury we have our

very own Alpaca Farm ... INDIAN PRAIRIE AL-PACAS owned by Steve & Renae Ruple.

Steve & Renae are two of the kindest people you'd ever hope to meet.

Hold on though ... Steve & there's more! Renae are soon to host their 3RD ANNUAL AL-PACA OPEN HOUSE & CARNIVAL! It's on Saturday, September 26 (just a few short days away) from 10AM - 4PM. They are located at 11134 C.R. 2! This is going to be one funfilled day of activities, discovery, education and to top that off ... local arti-

sans will be there performing demonstrations of their crafts!

Steve & Renae have a really nice website that showcases their passion: www.Indianprairiealpacas.c

It is worth the time it takes to visit. I was thankful for the easy navigation and the beautiful pictures throughout. Did you know that alpacas are only shorn once a year and that the average alpaca yields 4 to 6 pounds of wool (fleece) although some yield up to as much as 10+ pounds?

Steve & Renae began "farming" alpacas in 2006 with four of the soft, cuddly, furry little critters. 21 alpacas later (a total of 25 now) they are loving it

more than ever. Renae spends her entire day with the alpacas. Her hands-on approach keeps them all just as sweet as can be.

Alpacas are excellent with children. They stand (full grown) about waist high to an adult (their backs) and then their long necks bring their heads up about face to face high with an average adult.

The Ruples shear the animals on site as well as process part of

their fleece into batts for local area crafters. They work with a mill to get the fleece spun into yarn.

There is a small shop at the farm that sells byproducts from the alpacas such as hats, scarves, gloves, mittens and tiny stuffed bears & alpacas as well as a wide variety of yarns.

The ALPACA OPEN HOUSE & CARNIVAL is always held on the last weekend of September but if you can't make it ... don't fret. Steve & Renae invite anyone from individuals to groups to stop by anytime by appointment. They are happy to show you around and let you pet the animals.

They offer free consultations, sales, breeding, assis-

tance in start-up of your own alpaca farm/fiber processing and they top it off with excellent customer service! I could go on and on introducing you to this neighbor but I strongly suggest you go on out to the festival next weekend and introduce yourself! You'll be glad you did and if you take the kids I guarantee it will be one of those family outings that they will cherish for years to come!


